

School notices

Please be aware

We educate our students about drugs in different ways and at different times, depending on their age and their level of vulnerability and maturity. As with sex education, the `neither too soon nor too late` mantra applies here as well. We also have a large site which requires extra vigilance from a Safeguarding perspective, both during school times and in the evenings, weekends and holidays. In common with other school we will avail ourselves from time to time of police sniffer-dog spot checks. These are not targeted at specific students or classes, but can serve as a useful deterrent. Please don't be alarmed if your child comes back with tales of police dogs sniffing at bags and lockers. Sadly, in this day and age, it is routine. Alan Swindell, Principal

Neither too soon nor too late. Sex education and the C Card Programme. Recently, and in line with most secondary schools in the UK, we have agreed to participate in the `C Card Programme`.

The programme enables older students (age 13 and above) to obtain a C card, which in turn gives them access to free contraception (condoms). Before being issued with such a card the student needs to have an in-depth conversation with the school nurse or a specifically trained member of staff. The aim of the conversation is to establish that the student understands the importance of safety, consent and the benefits of waiting for the right supportive context before starting a sexual relationship. This advice is confidential. The law makes clear that parents do not have the right to know that their child has been given a C card, but the student is always encouraged to be honest and open and to discuss their choice with their parents.

We support the programme because of the positive impact it has had in reducing teenage pregnancies and STDs nationally.

Our school teaches students about relationships and sex in a variety of ways. Main lessons including class 5 Botany, class 6 Lifecycles and class 7 Nutrition and Hygiene all give a context in which to explore some of the universal themes that underpin relationships and procreation. We also dedicate a portion of our PSHE (Personal, Social and Health Education) curriculum to provide all pupils with the age-appropriate information they need to understand attitudes and values around sex, and to develop the awareness and skills to make their own choices when the time comes.

The teaching is backed up by a comprehensive `Relationship and Sex Education` policy that can be viewed on our web site. Its aim is to support `lifelong learning about physical, moral and emotional development, deepening understanding of the importance of stable and loving relationships, respect, love and care. It is also about the teaching of sex, sexuality, and sexual health.`.


As part of the centenary celebrations, Steiner
